A parishioner writes:

SUNDAY REFLECTION

November 4th is just another ordinary day and yet in 1922 it marked one of the greatest Egyptology discoveries of modern times – the opening of the tomb of Tutankhamun by Howard Carter. The wonders and treasures of another world became evident to the new.

Today we have a treasure given to us in the Bible passage for our Gospel reading and reflection. The greatest command given to us by Jesus himself – a quick summary of this is simply "love God and Love your neighbour". We hear it often in our Biblical world and yet do we reflect on it and what it means for us? At the heart of this passage is Love, we need to embrace that fact as part of our inner logic so that we can put in action what Jesus is asking of us. If we want to know God we have to love our neighbour, we cannot hate our neighbour if we want to be a follower, if we want to be "not far from the Kingdom of God".

In our South London affluence we may think that putting that into practice is someone else's responsibility, yet there are daily times when we show by our own words and deeds that we have embraced the love of God and neighbour. It can be reflected in the random acts of kindness or kind words of understanding that we show to others or by commitment to action in doing something positive for those less well off than ourselves. There is a wonderful film called the Field of Dreams, and the key line in the film is "if you build it he will come", it's about a dream of building a baseball stadium to house a game of old players from the past. It is a film of redemption and reality. That needs to be our message – if we build a life of Faith in community, "He" will be with us. Let us honour in this month of November when we remember so many who gave their lives for others, the greatest "discovery" of our lives, the need to love God and to love our neighbour as ourselves.
